**[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING
MOTION FOR TEMPORARY
RESTRAINING ORDER,
PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION, OR
STAY OF AGENCY ACTION
PURSUANT TO 5 U.S.C. § 705**

1 Having reviewed and fully considered the Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order,
2 Preliminary Injunction, or Stay of Agency Action pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 705, the accompanying
3 memorandum, the declarations and their attached exhibits, and the complaint on file in this action,
4 as well as having heard oral argument of the parties, and for the reasons stated in the Court’s
5 Opinion issued this date, it is hereby:

6 **ORDERED** that Plaintiff Anthropic PBC’s Motion is **GRANTED**; it is further

7 **ORDERED** that Defendants and all of their agents, officers, employees, representatives,
8 successors, assigns, and all other persons acting for, with, by, through, or under authority from
9 Defendants, or in concert or participation with Defendants, are immediately restrained and
10 enjoined, pending final resolution of this action or further order of this Court:

- 11 1. from implementing, applying, or enforcing in any manner: (A) the February 27,
12 2026 Presidential Directive ordering all federal agencies to cease use of Anthropic’s
13 technology; (B) any and all other agency actions taken in response to the
14 Presidential Directive; (C) the February 27, 2026 Secretarial Order designating
15 Anthropic a “Supply-Chain Risk to National Security” and directing that no
16 contractor, supplier, or partner doing business with the United States military may
17 conduct commercial activity with Anthropic; and (D) the March 4, 2026 Secretarial
18 Letter notifying Anthropic of the Secretary’s supply chain designation and
19 purporting to formalize that designation under 10 U.S.C. § 3252 and describe its
20 effects (collectively, the “Challenged Actions”);
- 21 2. from issuing or maintaining any guidance, directive, communication, or instruction
22 to any officer, employee, contractor, or agent, in furtherance of or implementing the
23 Challenged Actions; and
- 24 3. from taking any other action to implement, effectuate, or further the purposes of the
25 Challenged Actions; it is further

26 **ORDERED** that effective date of the Secretarial Order and the Secretarial Letter is stayed
27 pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 705; it is further

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ORDERED that Defendants shall file a status report no later than forty-eight (48) hours after entry of this Order, describing the steps taken to ensure compliance with this Order and certifying compliance with its requirements.
